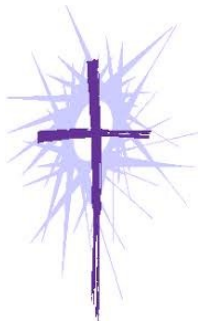

## Coronavirus and Communion under one Kind

It is highly likely by the time you read this that the Bishops of England and Wales will have decided to instruct people to receive only the Sacred Host at Holy Mass and not to receive the Precious Blood. (*Please note it is not 'the bread and wine' but has been changed into Christ's Sacred Body and Blood by the action of the Priest.*)

Sometimes this can cause people confusion and they think that they are not receiving something they should, or that they are not fully receiving Christ at Mass. So this is a good opportunity to talk a little about what actually happens at Mass, and what is expected, and what the Church actually says.

God brought about the Sacrament so that we could know that He was working the souls of his creatures - us. Because He works in our souls (and they cannot be seen) and because He works in a supernatural way, giving us His Grace (which also cannot be seen) so we need external signs so that we **know** that something has happened, even though it might be beyond our senses. This is why we define a sacrament as an 'outward and visible sign of an inward and invisible grace'. The outward bits are easy enough to see. And so we can know that He has done something, and brought about a change which we cannot see, God created the Sacred Priesthood. We men of God exist to bring about the Sacraments for your, and our salvation. *And yes only men can be priests, and this can't change - if you want I can go into that at another time, but that's the way God set it up, and we don't mess with it.*

So at Holy Mass, though the action of the Priest, bread and wine are transformed into the true and real, Body and Blood of Christ. But (**and this is the important bit**) because in a human being the blood is in the flesh, and the flesh needs the blood, they were not separated in Christ. So where there is His Blood, there there is His Flesh, and where there is His Flesh, there there is His Blood.

The Sacred Host contains the Body and Blood of Christ, the Precious Blood also contains the Body and Blood of Christ. You need only to receive either to receive the fulness of Christ. This is the doctrine of concomitance.

*There is no need, and there never has been a need, to receive in both kinds to receive the fulness of Christ.*

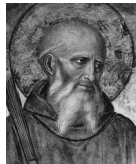
